Once I sat down with Photoshop, all I had to do was create what I've always dreamed. I never thought of the imagery as art. I was just having fun. And as I showed the results to more and more people, I had extremely positive feedback"

Since then, Eric has shown his work in galleries and created over 100 original works using his own photography.









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Eric prides himself on working strictly in high resolution and using his own photography for source material. "I think if you use imagery from magazines or other websites, your final piece isn't truly yours. It's a collaboration."

His work as a freelance photographer takes him everywhere from underground fashion shows to spectacular aerial shots taken from his hang glider.

"The greatest thing about creating this artwork is that I still do it purely for fun. I'm not trying to convery deep emotions or make lofty statements about the existance of humanity. I just make things that I think look sorta cool. If other people like it, great. If not, I won't lose any sleep over it."
